There are lots of great reasons to attend a California Community College (CCC). A CCC may be the best fit for you if:

- You need an **associate degree or certificate** for the career you want.
- You want to **start your career sooner**. Associate degree programs usually take two years. Certificate programs take even less time.
- You want to **prepare to transfer** to a four-year college.
- You want to **spend less money** on college tuition. CCCs have the lowest fees in the nation.
- You want to **stay close to home**. With 115 campuses across California, there is probably a CCC close to you.
- You need **flexible classes** in the evening, on weekends, or online so you can fit college into your life.
- You want to **get a head start on earning college credit** while you're still in high school.

Requirements

To attend a CCC, all you have to do is fill out an application and pay any required fees. You don't have to complete A-G requirements or take any special classes.

Transfer Options

You can start at a CCC and transfer to a CSU, UC, or independent college after two years. Complete one of the programs below at your CCC to secure your spot.

- The [Transfer Admission Guarantee \(TAG\)](#) program guarantees you a spot at one of six UCs.

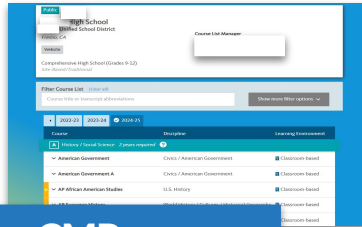

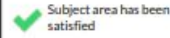

Targeted Interventions

Reporting features allow educators to take intentional action to support targeted groups of students.

For example, reports can help identify:

- ▶ Students who have not explored career options
- ▶ Students off-track for CSU or UC Eligibility
- ▶ Seniors who have not launched FAFSA or CADAA
- ▶ Seniors who have not applied to any CCC, CSU, or UC
- ▶ Students who are CSU-eligible or UC-eligible, but have not applied
- ▶ Reports can be disaggregated or filtered to identify priority student groups, such as:
 - African American students
 - Latino male students
 - Foster or homeless youth students

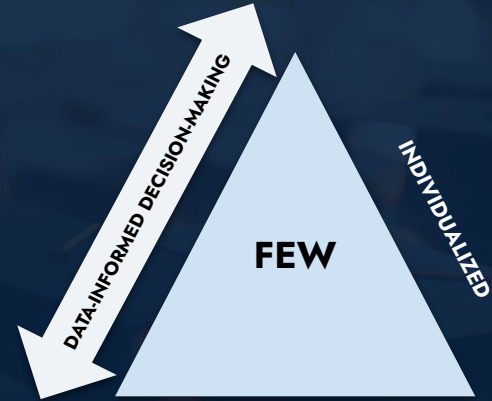

Building Efficiencies

When work at Tier 1 and Tier 2 is more efficient, School Counselors have more time to provide individualized interventions at Tier 3.





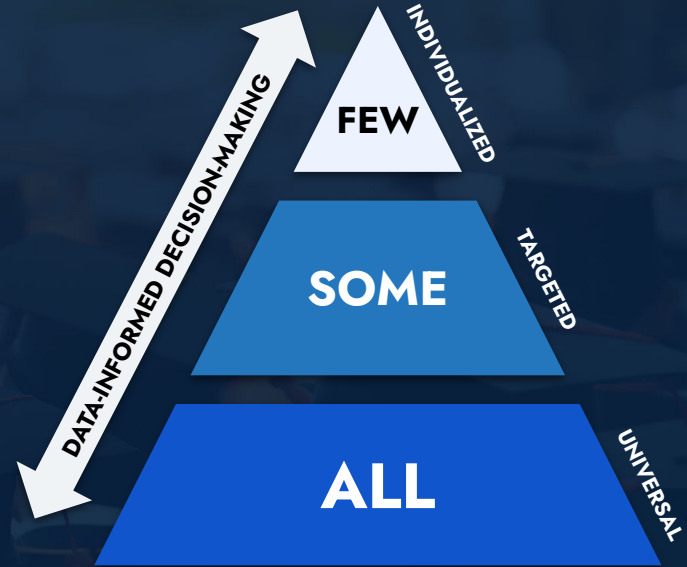
1:1 Support

CaliforniaColleges.edu tools can be leveraged within the individualized support that is provided to students who need it the most.

Examples:

- ▶ Utilizing the Career Assessments and Career Exploration Tools to help inform the Individualized Transition Plan (ITP) for a student with special education services
- ▶ Supporting an undocumented student to learn about their eligibility for the CADAA and the steps in the application process
- ▶ Leveraging the Accessibility Menu to ensure that a student who requires a screen reader or language translation is able to access the information about college, career, and financial aid options and eligibility
- ▶ Helping a Foster Youth to complete their CSU and/or UC application

- ▶ 17 AA Female Students grades 11th-12th grade
- ▶ GPA: 1.99 and below
- ▶ Participated in a intentional learning community that met 2x per week to develop academic, career, and personal social competencies.
 - Centered CaliforniaColleges.edu as a key resource that drove academic and career planning.
 - Weekly academic grade checks and quarterly academic planning
 - Monthly small group career exploration

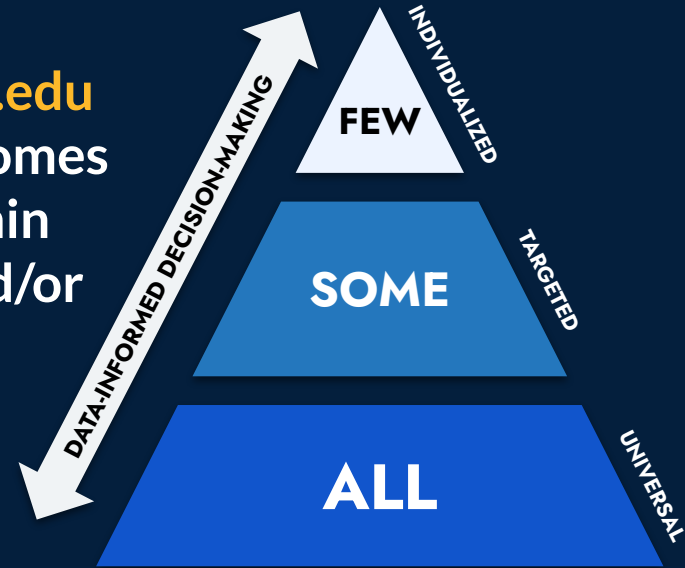

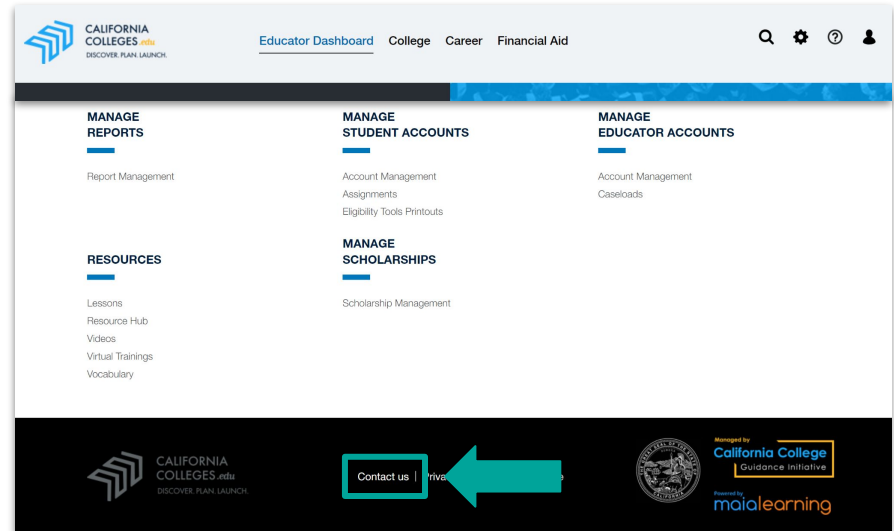
