
Our Role in the Cradle-to-Career Data System

CaliforniaColleges.edu is a crucial component of the C2C Data System.

AB 132 outlines specific steps in order to implement the Cradle-to-Career (C2C) Data System and realize its objectives, which include:

- Making CaliforniaColleges.edu tools and services free to all California school districts serving 6-12th grade students, with a goal of full participation by June 30, 2026.
- Designating CaliforniaColleges.edu as the preferred starting point for all applications to California public colleges (CCC, CSU, UC), FAFSA, and CADAA.

Data-Informed Decision Making

► The "Download Only: College Eligibility and Application Statuses" report offers a single, downloadable file to help educators identify students for intervention and/or opportunities:



- Filter this report in multiple ways to answer questions, such as:
 - Which students have an eligible CSU or UC GPA, but have not applied?
 - Which students have applications in progress, but not yet submitted?







A-G Alignment Support

CCGI provides technical assistance help LEAs ensure that courses indicated as fulfilling A-G requirements match the CMP.

- ► California Education Code 60900(g) requires that LEAs maintain at least a 90% rate of alignment between A-G coursework, as listed in the local SIS, and how those courses are registered in the UC Course Management Portal A-G course list.
- CCGI has a dedicated Technical Assistance team to support districts in improving their
 CMP match rate
- CaliforniaColleges.edu reporting features help educators identify and resolve issues with their CMP list that may impact eligibility for students:
 - Academic Report: Which district courses are flagged as A-G but do not match against the CMP?
