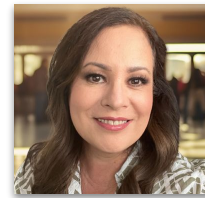

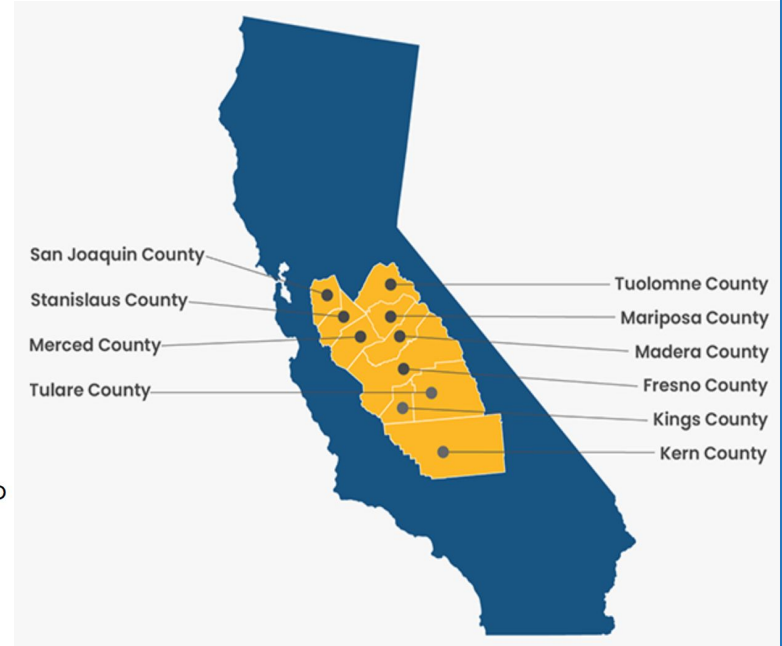

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Our Role in the Cradle-to-Career Data System

CaliforniaColleges.edu is a crucial component of the C2C Data System.

AB 132 outlines specific steps in order to implement the Cradle-to-Career (C2C) Data System and realize its objectives, which include:

- ▶ Making CaliforniaColleges.edu tools and services **free to all California school districts serving 6-12th grade students**, with a goal of full participation by June 30, 2026.
- ▶ Designating CaliforniaColleges.edu as the **preferred starting point for all applications to California public colleges (CCC, CSU, UC), FAFSA, and CADAA.**

The Eligibility and Application Report can be leveraged in different ways during the school year to identify strategic supports.

During CSU/UC Application Window

- ▶ Identify CSU and UC eligible students who have not yet completed a CSU or UC application.

After CSU/UC Application Window

- ▶ Identify students who have not yet completed an application to any college
- ▶ Identify college applicants to have not yet applied to FAFSA/CADAA

After College/Financial Aid Application Window

- ▶ Review college application data to identify best practices and challenges for next application window.

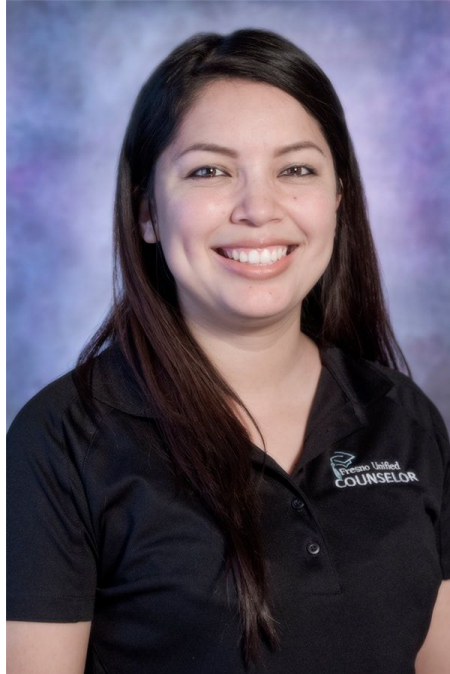

Data-Informed Decision Making

District educators can view application statuses to all CCC, CSU, and/or UC campuses – updated nightly - and Financial Aid application status.

CCGI provides technical assistance help LEAs ensure that courses indicated as fulfilling A-G requirements match the CMP.

- ▶ California Education Code 60900(g) requires that LEAs maintain at least a 90% rate of alignment between A-G coursework, as listed in the local SIS, and how those courses are registered in the UC Course Management Portal A-G course list.
- ▶ CCGI has a dedicated Technical Assistance team to support districts in improving their CMP match rate
- ▶ CaliforniaColleges.edu reporting features help educators identify and resolve issues with their CMP list that may impact eligibility for students:
 - Academic Report: **Which district courses are flagged as A-G but do not match against the CMP?**

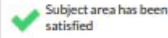

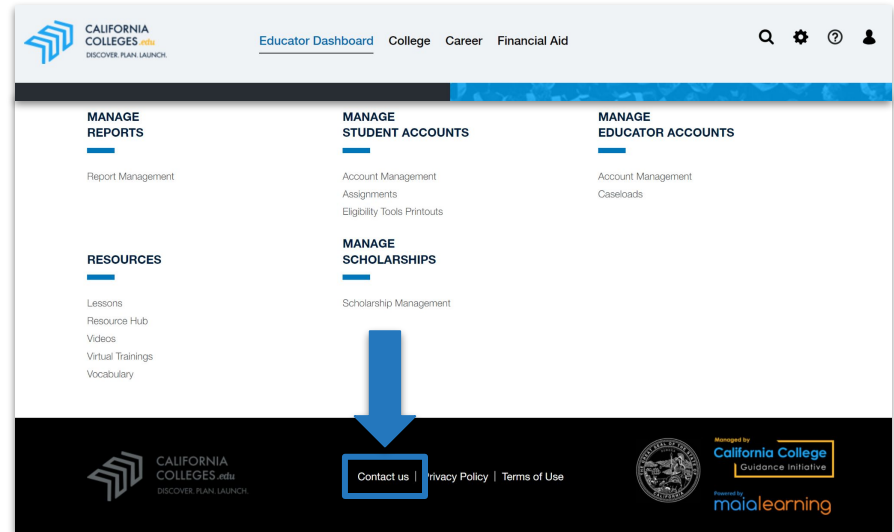

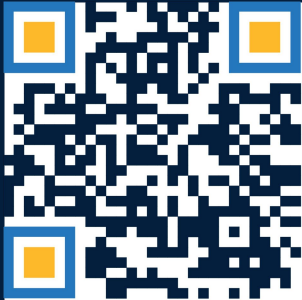
