Troubleshooting Accounts

► Out-of-District Emails

- If a student first registered their account in another district, they may need to change their email in the platform.
- Reset the student's password and have them log in using old email. They can then edit their account to change to new email.

► Resetting Passwords

- Anyone with an educator account can assist students with a manual password reset
- Alternatively students can reset their password via email by clicking "reset password"

► If you do not see a student account check if they have been opted out

There are lots of great reasons to attend a California Community College (CCC). A CCC may be the best fit for you if:

- You need an **associate degree or certificate** for the career you want.
- You want to **start your career sooner**. Associate degree programs usually take two years. Certificate programs take even less time.
- You want to **prepare to transfer** to a four-year college.
- You want to **spend less money** on college tuition. CCCs have the lowest fees in the nation.
- You want to **stay close to home**. With 115 campuses across California, there is probably a CCC close to you.
- You need **flexible classes** in the evening, on weekends, or online so you can fit college into your life.
- You want to **get a head start on earning college credit** while you're still in high school.

Requirements

To attend a CCC, all you have to do is fill out an application and pay any required fees. You don't have to complete A-G requirements or take any special classes.

Transfer Options

You can start at a CCC and transfer to a CSU, UC, or independent college after two years. Complete one of the programs below at your CCC to secure your spot.

- The [Transfer Admission Guarantee \(TAG\)](#) program guarantees you a spot at one of six UCs.

CSU and UC Eligibility Tools for Students

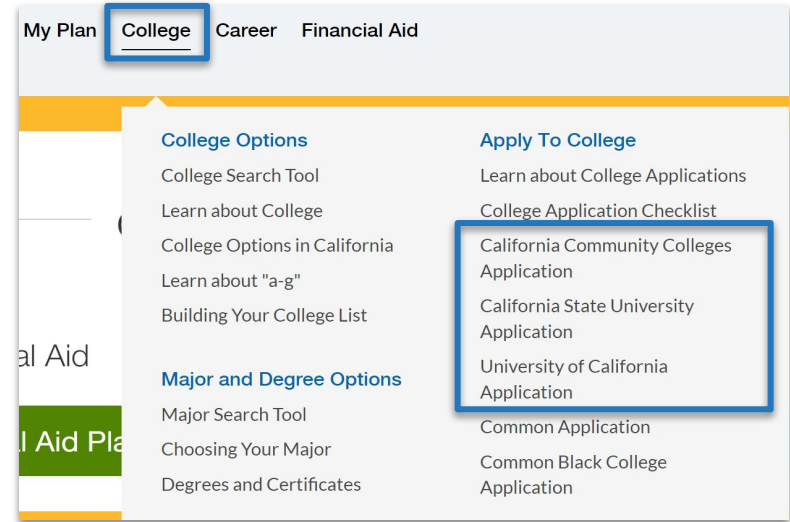

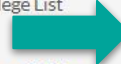

What It Does	What It Does NOT Do
Saves time: Can <u>significantly reduce</u> the time required to complete CSU and UC applications.	It does NOT replace the need to review all course records for accuracy prior to application submission.
Reduces errors: Verifies high school course records against the CMP and pre-populates that information into Cal State Apply and UC applications.	
Supports intentional review: Allows counselors and college access staff to identify and focus time and energy on students records that are the most complex.	It does NOT replace the need for counselors and/or college access staff to support students.

Course Management Portal (CMP)



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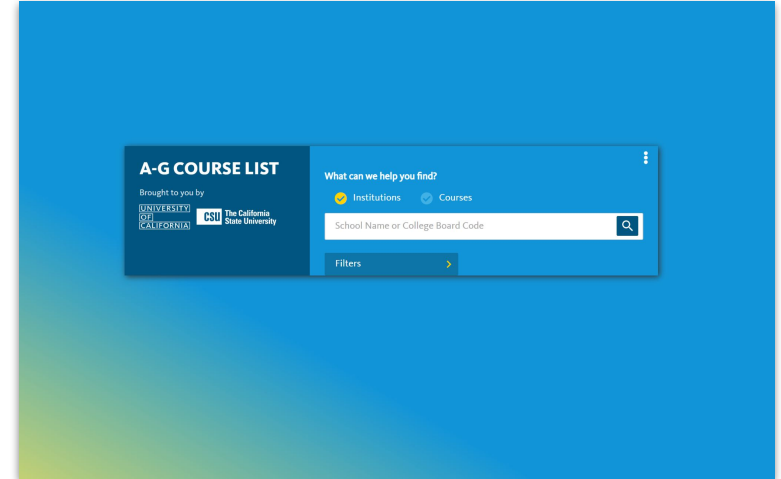
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The Course Management Portal

The Course Management Portal (CMP) is where all California districts and/or their schools manage their public-facing “A-G Course List”

- ▶ Every school that serves high school students in California needs to submit courses to the CMP for review and approval by UC, if that course is to appear on the school’s A-G Course List.
- ▶ The CMP course list is what determines which courses fulfill an “A-G” subject area for the purpose of CSU and UC admissions processes





What is A-G Misalignment?

A-G mismatch occurs when the way a course is listed in a district's Student Information System (SIS) doesn't align with the way it is listed in the CMP.





What A-G Misalignment Looks Like

CMP Misalignment inhibits successful electronic data transmission and may prevent CSU and UC campuses from recognizing A-G approved coursework.

A-G Alignment Support

CCGI provides technical assistance help LEAs ensure that courses indicated as fulfilling A-G requirements match the Course Management Portal

- ▶ California Education Code 60900(g) requires that LEAs maintain at least a 90% rate of alignment between A-G coursework, as listed in the local SIS, and how those courses are registered in the UC Course Management Portal A-G course list.
- ▶ CCGI has a dedicated Technical Assistance team to support districts in improving their CMP match rate
- ▶ CaliforniaColleges.edu reporting features help educators identify and resolve issues with their CMP list that may impact eligibility for students:
 - ▲ Academic Report: **Which district courses are flagged as “A-G” but do not match against the CMP?**

Verifying Courses Against the CMP

CaliforniaColleges.edu matches the course grade records provided by school districts against the school's A-G list in the Course Management Portal (CMP).

- ▶ CaliforniaColleges.edu uses the official CMP course list for each school to **verify the transcript data** shared by districts.
- ▶ Verification of data provided from the SIS against the CMP informs how coursework visualizes for students in the **CSU and UC eligibility tools** and impacts the **CSU and UC application course import**.

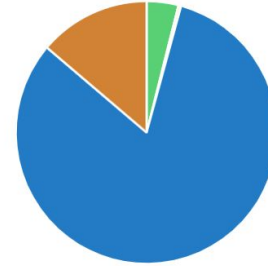

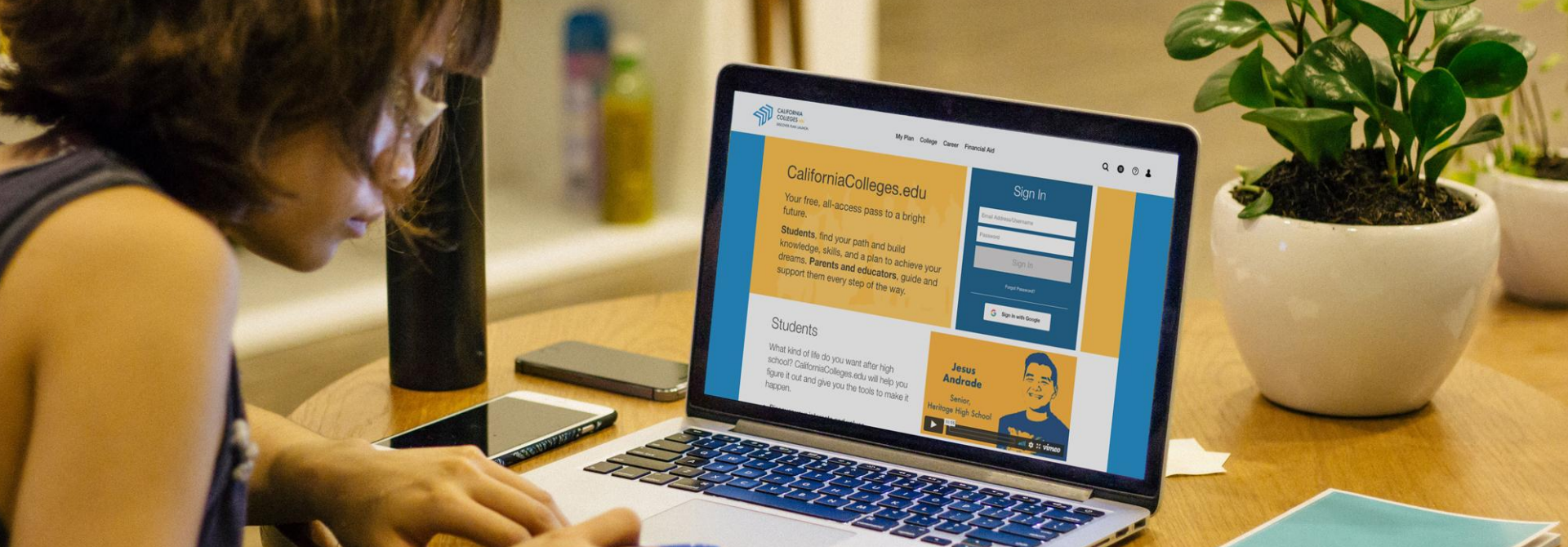

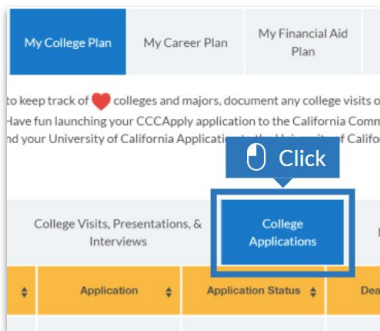
