Message the why to all stakeholders



Troubleshooting process



Initial and ongoing plan



Educator Reporting



Provide resources and toolkits to all stakeholders



Troubleshooting Accounts

Out-of-District Emails

- If a student first registered their account in another district, they may need to change their email in the platform.
- Reset the student's password and have them log in using old email. They can then edit their account to change to new email.

► Resetting Passwords

- Anyone with an educator account can assist students with a manual password reset
- Alternatively students can reset their password via email by clicking "reset password"



Troubleshooting Accounts Cont'd

- Is the student in the system with an out of district or personal email?
 - Does the student still have access to that email?
 - If yes: they can reset their own passwords.
 - If no: reset the password for the student either manually or by creating a temporary password.
- If a student doesn't see anything when they log into their account:
 - Student may be opted out by the family/guardians so won't have any transcript informed accounts
- If a student is not in the system at all:
 - Student may be opted out by the family/guardian







As a high school senior, you can launch your UC Application from CaliforniaColleges.edu and import your course and grade information into the "Academic History" section of your UC application.

NOTE: Importing courses doesn't replace the need to closely review all of your coursework before you submit your application.

• Tip: To import your coursework from CaliforniaColleges.edu, you must include your accurate 10-digit SSID number in the "About You" section of the application. You must also check the box right below the SSID field to allow your UC application status to be shared with the California College Guidance Initiative (also known as CaliforniaColleges.edu).

Add, Review and Edit Your Coursework

Add Missing Courses

Yellow courses in your UC Eligibility tab will ALWAYS require action in the UC Application. Your school indicates they meet an A-G requirement, but that can't be verified. These courses will not import into your application. You will have to add them manually.

These types of courses on your transcript also require special attention:

- Middle School Courses: If you took mathematics or foreign language courses in 7th and 8th grade to fulfill A-G requirements, you must add them into the "7th & 8th grade" subsection of the Academic history section.
 - o You should enter these courses only if you received a grade of C or better.

- Students do not have to transfer their coursework from CaliforniaColleges.edu to Cal State Apply in order to be included in this report.
- Students' application status is updated nightly and provided to CaliforniaColleges.edu by Cal State Apply.
 - o If a student has an application status of either In Progress or Received, then the student is considered as having 'started' an application. In Progress status means that the student's application has not been submitted or they have not paid the application fee. Received status means that the student's application has been submitted and is currently being processed. Encourage your students to check their email regularly, as well as the Student Portal(s) for each CSU campus they applied to.
 - Complete status means that the student's application fee(s) or fee waiver has been successfully submitted and their application is complete. This is the application's
 final status. Encourage your students to check their email regularly, as well as the Student Portal(s) for each CSU campus they applied to.






