



• Tip: To import your coursework from CaliforniaColleges.edu, you must include your accurate 10-digit SSID number in the "About You" section of the application. Add, Review and Edit Your Coursework

Add Missing Courses

Yellow courses in your UC Eligibility tab will ALWAYS require action in the UC Application. Your school indicates they meet an A-G requirement, but that can't be verified. These courses will not import into your application. You will have to add them manually.

These types of courses on your transcript also require special attention:

- Middle School Courses: If you took mathematics or foreign language courses in 7th and 8th grade to fulfill A-G requirements, you must add them into the "7th & 8th grade" subsection of the Academic history section.
 - o You should enter these courses only if you received a grade of C or better.
