



Major Exploration

Based on career interests, students explore programs and majors that interest them & learn more about what they involve.

College Exploration

Based on major exploration and using College Search, students find colleges that match their needs.



Provide more than one opportunity to take Career Assessments (i.e. 7th, 9th and 11th).



Students "favorite" careers they like.
Connect careers to career pathways.



Connect majors to careers and courses in high school to prepare.







Academic Planner and My Plan


Using the My Plan section students access their digital academic planner to make sure they're on track to achieve their college and career goals.





CSU and **UC** Eligibility Tools for Students

Students in partner districts can use CSU and UC eligibility tools to continuously progress monitor student GPA and "a-g" eligibility.





College Credit Courses

We want to be sure that we provide you with the most relevant and current instructions governing the coding of Dual Enrollment and High School Enrichment courses.

- Dual Enrollment and/or High School Enrichment courses are considered College Credit courses, not K-12 courses, for the purpose of college admission.
- ► College Credit courses should not be included on the high school course list in the Course Management Portal (CMP), even though instruction may happen on the high school campus with a high school instructor.
- ► College Credit courses must be reported under the appropriate college name within the Cal State Apply and UC Application in order for students to receive "a-g" eligibility credit for their College Credit coursework.

College Application Integrations

Students can launch college applications directly from CaliforniaColleges.edu and track their progress.





Benefits of Launching College Applications From CaliforniaColleges.edu

Students

- Centralized and reliable location to launch their California public higher education college and financial aid applications.
- Students with Partner Accounts can import their coursework from CaliforniaColleges.edu to their Cal State Apply application, which helps prevent errors that can delay or deny admission.
- If a student is enrolled in a Partner District, their transcript data will be passed to California Community Colleges along with their application, which can then be used to **inform** first-year course placement.

Educators

Centralized portal to track college application status to provide targeted student support.

Updated 12th Grade Financial Aid Lessons

The 12th grade financial aid lessons are currently available and updated to reflect the current changes to the FAFSA.

The Financial Aid Lessons:

- Help students identify which application they need to complete—the FAFSA or California Dream Act Application
- Provide students need-to-know information that can help them complete their Application, including
 - The need to create FSA IDs.
 - ▲ The need to provide consent
 - The role of contributors
 - Possibility of needing multiple contributors
- Include a checklist for students to begin gathering information and documents, which they can print out or reference on their Student Account


Academic Reports Example



- Monitor 4-Year Plans
- Target "a-g" eligible students for college application support
- Monitor CMP alignment
- ► Target students who are close to "a-g" eligibility for course remediation
- Identify 11th graders meeting UC 3.0 GPA requirement
- Preemptively identify mismatched courses to inform students and caregivers



Application Report Example



- College Application Report for CCC, CSU, and UC
 - A single, downloadable file that contains the status of all applications launched from CaliforniaColleges.edu to California's public higher education institutions and campuses
 - Downloads as a CSV



Reporting Tools

- Encourage shared responsibility by allowing educators to pull reports at any time.
- Allows educators to export reports into XSLX or CSV formats, depending on your needs.
- Help educators plan collective efforts and/or provide targeted intervention by showing students' progress.









Each grade-level activity has an associated lesson plan that educators can use during instructional time and counseling interventions.








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
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


Parent Accounts for Partner Districts

Parents can VIEW their student's activity on CaliforniaColleges.edu when they register their account.

- Student must have a registered account before the parent can create one
- Many districts only create accounts for their middle and high school students, which may or may not include 6th grade
- To register a parent account they will need to know their student's school ID number
- CaliforniaColleges.edu is translatable in multiple languages








Translation Features

Follow these steps to use Google Translate on CaliforniaColleges.edu:

- **Step 1** From any screen on CaliforniaColleges.edu, right click and select "**Translate to [...]**" from the dropdown.
- Step 2 The Google Translate box will open at the top of your screen. Click on the three dots icon, then "Choose another language".
- Step 3 Select the language you want from the drop-down, then click "Done".
